

STUDENT LEADERSHIP STRUCTURE





leadership

The Prefect body of SMA is steered by the Head Prefects, who are directly accountable to the Student Leadership Director (see Student Leadership Structure)

Selection

A select group of teachers, along with the Head Prefects, will conduct the interviews. Senior Prefects and Sub-prefects will be selected by the Student Leadership Directorate in consultation with teaching staff and SLT.

Eligibility

Candidates for prefect must be 6th form students who are in good standing with the institution, who can create a balance between their duties as prefects and education as students.

Responsibilities

- Plan activities to celebrate teachers on "Thank A Teacher Day."
- Work alongside the Student Council and BIG Group to organise Culture Day and other events.
- Provide support to Coaches and Senior Leadership
- Meet regularly to gather student voice.

OVERVIEW

The Student Council is a vital arm of Student Leadership at SMA. This group of students act as student advocates, raising the concerns of students while working in harmony with the leadership and rules of the school. The Assistant Student Leadership Director provides direct oversight of the Student Council. Student leaders are expected to follow the chain of command outlined in the Organisational chart.

Coaching Group Ambassadors

 Raise the concerns of students within your coaching group to Year Group Ambassadors

PRESIDENT

The President is the leader of the Student Council This position can be held by a student from any year group! This role carries the following responsibilities:

- Convene all meetings of the executive and Student Coucil body
- Coordinate all assigned events/tasks
- Make representation of the student body at meetings with Ms Fahey and Governors.
- Is our school's Timi Champion.

VICE-PRESIDENT

This position can be held by any student. This role carries the following responsibilities:

- Assist the President to lead meetings
- Meets Ms Fahey alongside the President
- Checks meeting minutes and supports secretary

SECRETARY

A student from any year group may hold this role. Our Secretary is responsible for:

- Maintain proper record of meetings held and matters discussed.
- Keep an up to date diary of Student Council activities and the students abreast with all events.

YEAR GROUP AMBASSADORS

- Raise the concerns of students within your year group at Student Council meetings.
- Attend all Student Council meetings

5 STEP ELECTION PROCESS FOR STUDENT COUNCIL COACHING GROUP AMBASSADORS

Nominations

Students can themselves to represent their coaching group. Every nomination must be seconded in order for it to be valid Nominations will be conducted by the Coach. Students must describe themselves in 3 words so that the coaching group understand why that student would make a great CGA.





Elections

Elections will be done by ballot. Each student must write ONE of the 3 nominated names on the ballot paper and return to the Coach.

Ballot Counting

The Coach will count the amount of times each name is written on a ballot. The name that's more frequently written at the end of the count will become the Student Council Representative for that Coaching Group.





Announcement

The Coach will announce the winner during Coaching Time.


themselves forward as a candidate for the Year Group Ambassador, who will further serve as a member of the SMA Student Council Executive Committee.

Nominations Review

Progress Leaders will review the names and nominations of each candidate.

Election

Progress Leaders will elect the candidate they think is best suited to represent the year group.



Ambassadorship

Every Year Group Ambassador will become a member of the SMA Student Council and can further serve as President, Vice President or Secretary. (see Student Council Executive for more details).

Nominations

Students who would like to sit on the Executive will nominate themselves to the Student Leadership Director.





Application

Students will write a short application explaining why they are great for the role.



Applications will be shared with the student body and students will decide who they think is the best candidate. Voting will take place in year group assemblies.


