RE: YEAR 11 INTERVENTION TIMETABLE

As your child has now entered **Year 11**, it is essential that they make the very best use of the time available in the lead up to their GCSE examinations. To support them, we have put in place a structured **after-school intervention programme** to help boost progress and ensure they achieve their full potential.

Your child is expected to attend intervention sessions on:

- **Tuesday**
- **Wednesday**
- **Friday**

These sessions are designed to give students additional guidance and targeted support in their subjects, which will have a **positive impact on their grades**. We strongly encourage you to speak with your child about the importance of attending every session and making the most of this opportunity.

Attendance at intervention is **compulsory**. If a student fails to attend without a valid reason, they will receive a **one-hour detention after school on Friday**. If, for any reason, your child is unable to attend intervention on a particular day, please contact me as soon as possible so that we can ensure they are not sanctioned.

Tuesday	Art*, French, Maths, RE, Spanish, Independent Study
Wednesday	Art, Business, Computer, Science, Geography, ICT, Science, Textiles, Independent Study
Thursday	Art*, Citizenship, English, History, Music, PE, Psychology, Independent Study

Students are allocated intervention based on their academic tracking and they will not be allowed to pick their own intervention; every 4-5 weeks there will be a subject change for their intervention throughout the school year.

During their mock exams interventions will not take place, if you have any concerns about subjects, please contact myself.

Dates of mock exams

- Week beginning 13th October, ends 14th of November
- Week beginning 2nd of February, ends 27th of February

If your child gets a U grade in their mocks during October and November, they will need to resit the exam in January.

We believe these interventions will make a significant difference in preparing your child for their upcoming exams, and we ask for your support in encouraging their full participation.
